**Explanation of Municipal Impact of Regulation:**

None, it is not expected to have an impact on municipalities, as licensure remains up to the individual.

**Explanation of Small Business Impact of Regulation:**

It is not expected that the revisions to these regulations will impact small businesses other than the fees associated with licensure of environmental professionals. Licensure is not a statutory or regulatory requirement, but an individual's option, much like a professional engineer's license. In part, the revisions will enable the licensee to obtain credit for continuing education for shorter courses and provides flexibility regarding licensing renewal. The proposed changes will allow the Board the flexibility to consider all coursework taken by an applicant for purposes of demonstrating their degree is fundamentally equivalent to those listed in the regulations. The changes will also provide greater flexibility in the number of classroom hours for short courses and within the disciplinary process to issue sanctions to a licensee other than suspend, deny or revoke a license.
