Currently, after making said application to the Department of Transportation, the registration issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles is deemed to be a temporary registration, at the gross vehicle weight stated in the permit issued by the Department of Transportation, for a period of ten (10) days. The amended regulation requires that the registration issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles, which is a permanent registration, reflects a gross vehicle weight that is equal to or greater than that stated in the overweight vehicle permit issued by the Department of Transportation.

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**Notice of Policies & Procedures**

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Public Health is implementing the following policies and procedures concerning "the prescriptive authority to prescribe medications to treat persons dependent on opiates in free standing substance abuse treatment facilities" under the authority of section 27 of Public Act 11-242.

"A substance abuse treatment facility that is licensed in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes, Section 19a-490 by the State of Connecticut, Department of Public Health (DPH) as a Facility for the Care and Treatment of Substance Abusive or Dependent Persons and includes the service classification of Outpatient Treatment shall permit licensed health care providers with prescriptive authority to prescribe a Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved medication for the treatment of opiate dependence. The Outpatient program shall do so in compliance with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations. Policies and procedures shall be developed and implemented by the facility to ensure the clients served receive the necessary services as identified in the client's comprehensive assessment. The program shall assist the client with accessing services if the program is unable to provide them."
