Notice of Intent to Amend and Adopt Regulations

In accordance with the provision of section 4-168(a) of the Connecticut General Statutes ("CGS"), as amended, the Director of the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station ("CAES") hereby gives notice of his intent, under the authority of CGS section 22-84, to amend sections 22-84-5d and 22-84-5e of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies and permanently adopt a new section, 22-84-5g.

On July 16, 2012, the Emerald ash borer (*Agrilus planipennis*) was first detected in Connecticut. This invasive and destructive insect species targets ash trees and causes rapid decline and eventual mortality in all ash species. Since its detection in Michigan in 2002, the pest has moved consistently west, east and south, including into the northeastern states of Pennsylvania and New York. The recent detection of Emerald ash borer in Connecticut was the first in New England, and it has since been detected in Berkshire County, Massachusetts. In addition to the Emerald ash borer, there is also an extensive infestation of the Asian longhorned beetle (*Anoplo-*

phora glabripennis) in Worcester County immediately north of Connecticut's border with central Massachusetts. The Asian longhorned beetle targets many hardwood tree species. In 2010, in view of these two pests and their proximity to Connecticut's borders, the Director of CAES promulgated regulations that specified his authority to regulate materials subject to infestation from these two pests. The proposed amendments and additional section described in this notice focus on the movement of firewood into and within the State of Connecticut. The movement of firewood from or through infested areas or potentially infested areas and into or through uninfested areas poses a significant threat for unknowingly moving and spreading both pests. In addition, the proposed amendments also make some clarifications and adjustments based on federal regulations and propose other minor but necessary revisions.

The amendments include:

- Changes that require wood chips to be at one-inch or less in two dimensions to be consistent with current federal guidelines for deregulating material.
- Clarification of the definition of regulated articles and firewood to specify different handling requirements for firewood.
- Specifying the use of "compliance agreements" as a means to comply with a Quarantine Order issued by the Director or through regulation.

Highlights of the additional section that restricts the movement of firewood into and within Connecticut include:

- The restrictions allow movement of firewood as long as it has been properly treated or is of an origin that poses no threat of infestation.
- Treatment requirements may vary to accommodate federal regulations in areas subject to quarantine.
- Compliance can be achieved through various instruments, including a permit issued by CAES, standing permission through a compliance agreement with CAES, or, if applicable, a self-issued certificates for movement of firewood within the state that does not involve quarantine areas.

Notice of Intent to Seek Renewal of Medicaid Waiver for Individual and Family Supports

In accordance with section 17b-8 of the general statutes, notice is hereby given that the Commissioner of Social Services intends to seek a renewal of the Individual and Family Supports Medicaid waiver designed to support persons with intellectual disabilities who live with family or in their own homes and have a strong natural support system. The individuals who will be supported by this waiver are reflective of the current population served by DDS but may have less comprehensive support needs than some other participants and/or may have many more natural or informal supports available to them that enable them to take advantage of the flexibility and variety of service options in this waiver in order to remain in their own or family home. These factors and the flexibility and variety of waiver services offered allow individuals to continue to be effectively supported by a waiver with a more limited benefit package.

This waiver includes traditional service-delivery and participant-directed options. The CT Level of Need Assessment and Risk Screening Tool is the method used to determine that an individual meets the Level of Care criterion for enrollment in the waiver.
