## ***AN ACT CONCERNING ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR PERMITS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective January 1, 2014*) The Commissioner of
- 2 Consumer Protection shall adopt regulations, in accordance with the
- 3 provisions of chapter 54 of the general statutes, to streamline the
- 4 alcoholic liquor permitting process.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

**SUMMARY:**

This bill requires the consumer protection commissioner to adopt regulations to streamline the alcoholic liquor permitting process. The Liquor Control Act requires each business in the liquor industry to hold a permit. Each permit has different requirements and limits the permittee's activities in different ways.
