***AN ACT CONCERNING A BARBERSHOP APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Connecticut State  
2 Apprenticeship Council, established pursuant to section 31-22n of the  
3 general statutes, shall, in consultation with the Commissioner of Public  
4 Health, study the feasibility of establishing a barbershop  
5 apprenticeship program within the Labor Department. Not later than  
6 January 1, 2014, the council shall, in consultation with the  
7 Commissioner of Public Health, report to the joint standing  
8 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
9 relating to public health and labor in accordance with the provisions of  
10 section 11-4a of the general statutes. Such report shall include, but not  
11 be limited to, recommendations for (1) establishing a barbershop  
12 apprenticeship program, (2) the time period needed to establish such  
13 program, and (3) educational and professional experience  
14 requirements for apprentices participating in the program.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>from passage</i>	New section

The bill, which requires the Connecticut State Apprenticeship Council to study the feasibility of establishing an apprenticeship barbershop program within the Labor Department, has no fiscal impact.
