The Committee on Higher Education and Employment Advancement reported through SEN. BYE of the 5th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY OF STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND DROP-OUT RATES IN RELATION TO FINANCIAL AID DISBURSEMENTS AT THE REGIONAL-COMMUNITY TECHNICAL COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2013*) The Board of Regents for Higher
2 Education shall study issues concerning student attendance and drop-
3 out rates in relation to financial aid disbursements at the regional
4 community-technical colleges. Not later than January 1, 2014, the
5 president of the Board of Regents shall report on such study, in
6 accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes,
7 to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
8 cognizance of matters relating to higher education.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
