Senate Bill No. 732

The Committee on Labor and Public Employees reported through SEN. OSTEN of the 19th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT CONCERNING WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARDS
AND THE CHRONICALLY UNEMPLOYED.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2013*) (a) There is established a Regional
2 Workforce Development Boards Task Force. The task force shall study:
3 (1) The current status of regional workforce development boards
4 within the state; (2) the effectiveness of regional workforce
5 development boards; and (3) whether redistricting regional workforce
6 development boards will better suit the needs of the chronically
7 unemployed within the state.

8 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members: (1) The
9 chairpersons and ranking members of the joint standing committee of
10 the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor
11 and public employees; (2) the Labor Commissioner, or said
12 commissioner's designee; (3) one member of the General Assembly
13 appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate; (4) one member
14 of the General Assembly appointed by the speaker of the House of

15 Representatives; (5) one member of the General Assembly appointed
 16 by the majority leader of the Senate; (6) one member of the General
 17 Assembly appointed by the majority leader of the House of
 18 Representatives; (7) one member of the General Assembly appointed
 19 by the minority leader of the Senate; and (8) one member of the
 20 General Assembly appointed by the minority leader of the House of
 21 Representatives.

22 (c) All appointments to the task force shall be made not later than
 23 July 31, 2013. Any vacancy shall be filled by the appointing authority.

24 (d) Not later than October 1, 2014, the task force shall submit a
 25 report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
 26 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
 27 relating to labor and public employees, in accordance with the
 28 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes.

29 (e) The task force shall terminate on October 1, 2014.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
