Substitute Senate Bill No. 1147

Senate, April 24, 2013

The Committee on Government Administration and Elections reported through SEN. MUSTO of the 22nd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT MAKING REVISIONS TO STATUTES CONCERNING THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 2-71g of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2013*):

3 The Joint Committee on Legislative Management shall provide
4 reasonable furniture, stationery and other necessary articles for the
5 General Assembly including [typewriters] computers, file cabinets and
6 other equipment necessary for its use. No sums may be expended for
7 such use unless such committee has approved the expenditures. The
8 Comptroller is directed to draw his order on the Treasurer in payment
9 for the same from the legislative appropriation for the current or
10 subsequent fiscal year.

11 Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 2-71h of the general statutes is
12 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*

13 1, 2013):

14 (a) The supervision, security, utilization and control of the State
 15 Capitol building, the State Capitol grounds and parking facilities,
 16 exclusive of the present offices and parking facilities of the Governor,
 17 Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of the State and Secretary of the Office
 18 of Policy and Management and their respective staffs, the Legislative
 19 Office Building and parking garage and related structures and the
 20 grounds and parking facilities thereon, and other facilities and areas
 21 made available to or used by the committee shall be as determined by
 22 the Joint Committee on Legislative Management. The Joint Committee
 23 on Legislative Management shall maintain such buildings, related
 24 structures, grounds and parking facilities. The Joint Committee on
 25 Legislative Management shall adopt regulations in accordance with
 26 the provisions of chapter 54 (1) for the maintenance of order within
 27 such buildings and related structures and on such grounds and on
 28 those grounds, buildings and facilities made available for the use of
 29 said committee, and (2) establishing the regular business hours for
 30 such buildings and all offices housed within such buildings. Any
 31 person violating any such regulations shall be fined not more than one
 32 hundred dollars, except that any person who parks a motor vehicle in
 33 violation of such regulations shall have committed an infraction and
 34 shall be fined not more than ninety dollars. The enforcement of such
 35 regulations shall be by the Office of State Capitol Police.
 36 Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, the Commissioner
 37 of Administrative Services may provide for additional parking on land
 38 under the control of the Joint Committee on Legislative Management
 39 with the approval of said committee.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
