

Re: Goerge Toth Claim Review

Dear Ms. Blanchard and Committee Membes::

I am writing to request your consideration of the Claim relating to my parishioner George Toth, who is requesting monetary relief relating to his extradition and detention by the State of Conneticut. Subsequent to his extradition it was determined by the investigation conducted by the Habeas Corpus Unit that by Connecticut not extraditing him from the west coast years earlier when the opportunity presented itself that his sentence continued to run while incarcerated in Oregon. And further that his Conneticut sentence and all warrants had expired relating to his Conneticut Case. Then following Judial review in August 2010, and the Judges signature, he was released from prison in Connecticut and allowed to return to his home in Tennessee.

As his pastor and friend, I was witness to many of the events in this case and have heard his accounts of the times over the years when he was either living on the streets in California or spending time in prison there that he would encounter problems with the claim Connecticut had on him. If he appied for work, or was stopped by any authority, Connecticut would be contatcted and then found that Connecticut had no interest in him. In the mean time he might have lost a housing situation, job or some other problem. He tells me of requesting that he be extradited to Connecticut when he was in danger in one of his incarceratons. Even this request was denied.

At present he is doing the best he can to build a new life. He is currently dealing with a number of medial conditions and is currently recovering from back surgery. As you can imagine he will be gratified with a positive resolution to his claim.


He asked me to relay that his original rquest for \$100,000.00 was done in haste and that he thinks a \$20,000.00 settlement is more reasonable. At the very least he hopes you will consider the years spent with the Connecticut claim hanging over his head following the completion of his sentence per the Habeas units determination and Judge's decision should warrant compensation.

If successful in his claim he plans to donate much of the money to the work of Creekview Farms Retreat as a way of helping others in need to find a place to grow and thrive.

I do hope that my letter offers some support of his claim. I pray that the work of this committee and the ultimate decision is helpful in the work of justice and to the spread of God's realm. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have questions resulting from this letter.
