Statement by Ct GMIS President and Manchester CIO Jack McCoy

1 The Web Portal creation should be implemented within the architecture of the new Nutmeg Network. This would imply both Municipal to Municipal access through the portal address and access for the Public to the Portal for municipal services.

Municipal Town Clerks services if those services take shared forms would involve Land records, Vital Birth and Death records, and Historic Records.

Another is Emergency and electronic disaster response portal address. This could be provided for use by the municipalities within the Nutmeg Network.

2 In Manchester we actually built and presented at a Town Clerks statewide Association meeting, a model application for land records search. This web application was proposed for cross-municipal use and for public access using standard land record Industry eRecords from all towns (PRIA Standard is the industry's own standard but not complied with at the time).

There is a study grant request through CROG for analysis using the Manchester prototype to confirm the scope of savings and improvement in service by doing a shared service development for all town Clerks. The Web Portal concept, implemented on the Statewide Nutmeg Network, would be a very cost-effective and technically elegant vehicle for this kind of shared service.
