AN ACT REQUIRING THE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM REVIEW AND INVESTIGATIONS COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF A STATE-WIDE POLICY FOR SCHOOL SECURITY STANDARDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That the General Assembly direct the Legislative Program Review
- 2 and Investigations Committee to study the feasibility of a state-wide
- 3 policy for school security standards. Such study shall include, but not
- 4 be limited to, (1) the cost of installing vehicle barriers, bullet proof and
- 5 intrusion resistant vestibules at primary building entrances and
- 6 electronic monitoring devices, and (2) an examination of a requirement
- 7 that all persons entering a school building verify their identity and
- 8 explain their purpose for being at the school.

Statement of Purpose:

To improve security in public schools in the state.
