Re: Proposed House Bill 6021: AN ACT CONCERNING  
INSPECTIONS FOR MOTOR VEHICLES WITH OVER ONE  
HUNDRED THOUSAND MILES.

Dear Committee Members:

I would like to express my OPPOSITION to H.B. 6021.  
The Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles already has within  
its regulations a safety inspection for vehicles after certain  
conditions in a period of time. Implementation of new regulations  
should, I feel, be left up to the CTDMV.

Modern vehicles today are able to go 250,000 to 300,000 miles  
in usage without major repairs. I would like to see the research  
done and the report that came up with the 100,000 mile figure.

The inspection I feel is unnecessary and an added expense and  
inconvenience to Connecticut's motorists. The research that should  
be done compared to other states with the added increase required  
in the budget for this research and inspection probably won't be  
justified. People with multiple vehicles with over one hundred  
thousand miles may only use some vehicles a few miles a year.  
The safety inspection would then be unnecessary and an increase  
in cost to owning and operating a motor vehicle in the State of  
Connecticut by its residents. Thank you.
