"AN ACT CONCERNING STATE EMPLOYEE BENEFITS."

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Section 29-5 of the general statutes is repealed and the
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2013*):

5 (a) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection
6 may, within available appropriations, appoint suitable persons from

7 the regular state police force as resident state policemen in addition to
8 the regular state police force to be employed and empowered as state
9 policemen in any town or two or more adjoining towns lacking an
10 organized police force, and such officers may be detailed by said
11 commissioner as resident state policemen for regular assignment to
12 such towns, provided each town shall pay sixty per cent of the cost of
13 compensation, maintenance and other expenses of the state policemen
14 detailed to such town, and on and after July 1, 2011, each town shall
15 pay seventy per cent of such regular cost and other expenses and one
16 hundred per cent of any overtime costs. [and such portion of fringe
17 benefits directly associated with such overtime costs.] Such town or
18 towns and the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public
19 Protection are authorized to enter into agreements and contracts for
20 such police services, with the approval of the Attorney General, for
21 periods not exceeding two years.

22 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section,
23 the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection shall
24 appoint a resident state policeman to serve in a pilot program
25 assignment for two towns lacking an organized police force or
26 constabulary and located within the jurisdiction of the same state
27 police troop pursuant to a memorandum of agreement with towns
28 requesting participation in the pilot program. Towns participating in
29 the pilot program shall be responsible for the costs and expenses of
30 such resident state policeman as provided in subsection (a) of this
31 section.

32 (c) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection
33 shall exercise such supervision and direction over any resident
34 policeman so appointed as said commissioner deems necessary, and
35 each appointee shall be required to conform to the requirements of
36 chapter 67. Each resident state policeman shall have the same powers
37 as officers of the regular state police force and be entitled to the same
38 rights and subject to the same rules and regulations as the Division of
39 State Police within the Department of Emergency Services and Public

40 Protection."
