

I would oppose allowing hunting on Sunday for several reasons. DEEP officers are already under staffed, and opening hunting on another day would just add to their burdens. Many people who are not hunters, but not anti hunters, only have one day to access public and private open spaces without, at times, real concern for their safety. They should be allowed their day of peace. Finally, game animals, particularly deer, are not over populated in many parts of the state, contrary to assertions by some people, both within and without the DEEP. For those areas that do have legitimate deer density issues, the very generous seasons and bag limits already in place are sufficient measures, and replace the necessity of implementing Sunday hunting.
