**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE POLICING OF INDIAN TRIBAL LAND."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 29-5 of the general statutes is repealed and the  
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2013*):

5 The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection  
6 [may] shall, within available appropriations, appoint suitable persons  
7 from the regular state police force as resident state policemen in  
8 addition to the regular state police force to be employed and  
9 empowered as state policemen in any town or two or more [adjoining]  
10 towns lacking an organized police force, and such officers may be  
11 detailed by said commissioner as resident state policemen for regular  
12 assignment to such towns, provided each town shall pay sixty per cent  
13 of the cost of compensation, maintenance and other expenses of the  
14 state policemen detailed to such town, and on and after July 1, 2011,  
15 each town shall pay seventy per cent of such regular cost and other

16 expenses and one hundred per cent of any overtime costs and such  
17 portion of fringe benefits directly associated with such overtime costs.  
18 Such town or towns and the Commissioner of Emergency Services and  
19 Public Protection are authorized to enter into agreements and contracts  
20 for such police services, with the approval of the Attorney General, for  
21 periods not exceeding two years. The Commissioner of Emergency  
22 Services and Public Protection shall exercise such supervision and  
23 direction over any resident policeman so appointed as said  
24 commissioner deems necessary, and each appointee shall be required  
25 to conform to the requirements of chapter 67. Each resident state  
26 policeman shall have the same powers as officers of the regular state  
27 police force and be entitled to the same rights and subject to the same  
28 rules and regulations as the Division of State Police within the  
29 Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Sec. 501	<i>October 1, 2013</i>	29-5
