**"AN ACT CONCERNING NEXT GENERATION CONNECTICUT."**

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Section 10a-109b of the general statutes is repealed and  
4 the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2013*):

5 (a) The purpose of The University of Connecticut 2000 Act is to  
6 promote the welfare and prosperity of the people of the state and the  
7 continuation and improvement of their educational opportunities by  
8 approving a special capital improvement program for The University  
9 of Connecticut and enabling The University of Connecticut to borrow  
10 money and enter into financing transactions in its own name, on behalf  
11 of the state, to expand the authority of The University of Connecticut  
12 to construct projects and to assure a state commitment to support the  
13 financing of the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, improvement

14 and equipping of facilities, structures and related systems for the  
15 benefit of the educational and economic development needs of the  
16 state and The University of Connecticut, all to the public benefit and  
17 good, and the exercise of the powers, to the extent and manner  
18 provided in The University of Connecticut 2000 Act, is declared to be  
19 for a public purpose and to be the exercise of an essential  
20 governmental function.

21 (b) The purposes of sections 10a-109gg to 10a-109mm, inclusive, and  
22 the provisions of sections 10a-109c to 10a-109e, inclusive, 10a-109g,  
23 10a-109n and 32-41s relating to The University of Connecticut Health  
24 Center and John Dempsey Hospital are to advance health care,  
25 education and economic development in the state by (1) encouraging  
26 collaboration, innovation, job creation and new investment by The  
27 University of Connecticut, various hospitals and other institutions  
28 involved in the health and bioscience industries of the state; (2)  
29 enabling (A) the construction of a new bed tower at John Dempsey  
30 Hospital, and (B) the renovation of academic, clinical and research  
31 space and the construction of a new ambulatory care center at The  
32 University of Connecticut Health Center to enhance the academic,  
33 clinical and research missions of The University of Connecticut School  
34 of Medicine and School of Dental Medicine; (3) facilitating the  
35 assumption of operational control of the neonatal intensive care unit  
36 located at John Dempsey Hospital by Connecticut Children's Medical  
37 Center resulting in a regional children's health care system and an  
38 increased adult medical surgical bed capacity for John Dempsey  
39 Hospital; (4) supporting the development of (A) a comprehensive  
40 cancer center to expand clinical trials and advance patient care at  
41 multiple sites in the Hartford region, (B) a state-of-the-art simulation  
42 and conference center to be located on the campus of Hartford  
43 Hospital that will be used to educate and train health care  
44 professionals utilizing new technologies and simulated care settings,  
45 (C) a primary care institute located on the campus of Saint Francis  
46 Hospital and Medical Center, the Connecticut Institute for Primary  
47 Care Innovation, that is intended to increase the number of primary

48 care providers in the state by engaging in research and training to  
49 facilitate the effective delivery of primary care, (D) a health disparities  
50 institute sponsored by The University of Connecticut that will enhance  
51 research and the delivery of care to the minority and medically  
52 underserved populations of the state, (E) a Permanent Regional Phase  
53 One Clinical Trials Unit to be located at The Hospital of Central  
54 Connecticut, (F) a cancer treatment center to be located in its entirety  
55 within the city of New Britain, and (G) patient room renovations at  
56 Bristol Hospital; and (5) fostering growth in the bioscience sector of the  
57 state's economy by extending the same benefits afforded to businesses  
58 located in an enterprise zone to businesses that are engaged in  
59 bioscience and located in the city of Hartford or certain areas in the  
60 town of Farmington, the city of New Britain and the city of Bristol.

61 (c) The purposes of the construction, renovations, infrastructure and  
62 equipment related to Next Generation Connecticut are to: (1) Develop  
63 preeminence in The University of Connecticut's research and  
64 innovation programs, (2) hire and support outstanding faculty, (3)  
65 train and educate graduates to meet the future workforce needs of  
66 Connecticut, and (4) initiate collaborative partnerships that lead to  
67 scientific and technological breakthroughs. For purposes of this section  
68 and section 3 of this act, "Next Generation Connecticut" means UConn  
69 2000, as modified by this act.

70 Sec. 2. (Effective July 1, 2013) Not later than December 31, 2019, and  
71 five years thereafter, the university shall conduct an assessment of the  
72 university's progress in meeting the purposes set forth in subsection (c)  
73 of section 10a-109b of the general statutes, as amended by this act. The  
74 university shall select peers from nationally-ranked research  
75 universities to conduct such assessment. The selected peers shall seek  
76 input from the chairpersons and ranking members of the joint standing  
77 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
78 relating to finance, revenue and bonding, commerce and higher  
79 education prior to the completion of such assessment.

80 Sec. 3. (Effective July 1, 2013) The University of Connecticut shall

81 develop a comprehensive plan to guide Next Generation Connecticut  
82 investments. The university shall develop such plan in consultation  
83 with: (1) An industry advisory board selected by the university that  
84 shall be representative of the state's science, technology, engineering  
85 and math-related industries and shall include, but not be limited to,  
86 chief science officers or chief technology officers from such industries;  
87 (2) an independent research and development advisory firm selected  
88 by the university; (3) university academic leaders; (4) federal and  
89 private funding agencies; and (5) research and innovation benchmarks  
90 identified by the university and an analysis of the university's progress  
91 in meeting such benchmarks in comparison to nationally-ranked  
92 research universities. Such plan shall identify strategic growth areas  
93 for the research, innovation, workforce and economic development  
94 needs of Connecticut. The industry advisory board, independent  
95 research and development advisory firm and university academic  
96 leaders shall seek input from the chairpersons and ranking members of  
97 the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having  
98 cognizance of matters relating to finance, revenue and bonding,  
99 commerce and higher education prior to the completion of the plan.  
100 The Board of Trustees of The University of Connecticut shall review  
101 and approve such plan not later than July 1, 2014.

102 Sec. 4. Subdivision (10) of subsection (a) of section 10a-109d of the  
103 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
104 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2013*):

105 (10) To borrow money and issue securities to finance the acquisition,  
106 construction, reconstruction, improvement or equipping of any one  
107 project, or more than one, or any combination of projects, or to refund  
108 securities issued after June 7, 1995, or to refund any such refunding  
109 securities or for any one, or more than one, or all of those purposes, or  
110 any combination of those purposes, and to provide for the security and  
111 payment of those securities and for the rights of the holders of them,  
112 except that the amount of any such borrowing, the special debt service  
113 requirements for which are secured by the state debt service

114 commitment, exclusive of the amount of borrowing to refund  
115 securities, or to fund issuance costs or necessary reserves, may not  
116 exceed the aggregate principal amount of (A) for the fiscal years  
117 ending June 30, 1996, to June 30, 2005, inclusive, one billion thirty  
118 million dollars, (B) for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2006, to June 30,  
119 [2018] 2024, inclusive, [one billion seven hundred nineteen million nine  
120 hundred thousand] three billion two hundred seventy million nine  
121 hundred thousand dollars, and (C) such additional amount or  
122 amounts: (i) Required from time to time to fund any special capital  
123 reserve fund or other debt service reserve fund in accordance with the  
124 financing transaction proceedings, and (ii) to pay or provide for the  
125 costs of issuance and capitalized interest, if any; the aggregate amounts  
126 of subparagraphs (A), (B) and (C) of this subdivision are established as  
127 the authorized funding amount, and no borrowing within the  
128 authorized funding amount for a project or projects may be effected  
129 unless the project or projects are included in accordance with  
130 subsection (a) of section 10a-109e;

131 Sec. 5. Subsection (a) of section 10a-109e of the general statutes is  
132 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*  
133 *1, 2013*):

134 (a) The university may administer, manage, schedule, finance,  
135 further design and construct UConn 2000, to operate and maintain the  
136 components thereof in a prudent and economical manner and to  
137 reserve for and make renewals and replacements thereof when  
138 appropriate, it being hereby determined and found to be in the best  
139 interest of the state and the university to provide this independent  
140 authority to the university along with providing assured revenues  
141 therefor as the efficient and cost effective course to achieve the  
142 objective of avoiding further decline in the physical infrastructure of  
143 the university and to renew, modernize, enhance and maintain such  
144 infrastructure, the particular project or projects, each being hereby  
145 approved as a project of UConn 2000, and the presently estimated cost  
146 thereof being as follows:

147 Sec. 6. Subdivision (1) of subsection (a) of section 10a-109g of the  
 148 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
 149 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2013*):

150 (a) (1) The university is authorized to provide by resolution, at one  
 151 time or from time to time, for the issuance and sale of securities, in its  
 152 own name on behalf of the state, pursuant to section 10a-109f. The  
 153 board of trustees of the university is hereby authorized by such  
 154 resolution to delegate to its finance committee such matters as it may  
 155 determine appropriate other than the authorization and maximum  
 156 amount of the securities to be issued, the nature of the obligation of the  
 157 securities as established pursuant to subsection (c) of this section and  
 158 the projects for which the proceeds are to be used. The finance  
 159 committee may act on such matters unless and until the board of  
 160 trustees elects to reassume the same. The amount of securities the  
 161 special debt service requirements of which are secured by the state  
 162 debt service commitment that the board of trustees is authorized to  
 163 provide for the issuance and sale in accordance with this subsection  
 164 shall be capped in each fiscal year in the following amounts, provided,  
 165 to the extent the board of trustees does not provide for the issuance of  
 166 all or a portion of such amount in a fiscal year, all or such portion, as  
 167 the case may be, may be carried forward to any succeeding fiscal year

168 and provided further, the actual amount for funding, paying or  
 169 providing for the items described in subparagraph (C) of subdivision  
 170 (10) of subsection (a) of section 10a-109d, as amended by this act, may  
 171 be added to the capped amount in each fiscal year:

172 Sec. 7. Subsection (a) of section 10a-109n of the general statutes is  
173 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*  
174 *1, 2013*):

175 (a) For the period from July 1, 2001, to June 30, [2018] 2024, or until  
176 completion of the UConn 2000 infrastructure improvement program,  
177 whichever is later, the university shall have charge and supervision of  
178 the design, planning, acquisition, remodeling, alteration, repair,  
179 enlargement or demolition of any real asset or any other project on its  
180 campuses.

181 Sec. 8. Section 10a-109x of the general statutes is repealed and the  
182 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2013*):

183 (a) Not later than October 1, 1995, and semiannually thereafter, the  
184 university shall report to the Governor and the joint standing  
185 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
186 relating to the Department of Education, to finance, revenue and  
187 bonding, and to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies on  
188 the status and progress of UConn 2000. Each report shall include, but  
189 not be limited to: (1) Information on the number of projects and  
190 securities authorized, approved and issued hereunder including,  
191 relative to such projects, project costs, timeliness of completion and  
192 any problems which have developed in implementation, and a  
193 schedule of projects remaining and their expected costs; (2) the amount  
194 of revenue available from all sources for such remaining projects and  
195 expected receipts for such remaining projects for the succeeding four  
196 quarters; (3) the amount of money raised from private sources for the  
197 capital and endowment programs and the progress made in the  
198 development and implementation of the fund-raising program; and (4)  
199 any cooperative activities with other public and independent  
200 institutions of higher education commenced in the preceding six  
201 months. Each such report shall, for the preceding six-month period,  
202 (A) specify the moneys credited to such fund on account of, or derived

203 from, each source of state and federal revenue, (B) specify the amount  
204 of investment earnings from the fund, (C) specify the moneys from  
205 such fund applied and expended for (i) the payment of debt service  
206 requirements, (ii) the payment of the principal of and interest on  
207 securities issued hereunder and general obligation bonds of the state  
208 issued for university capital improvement purposes, and (iii) each  
209 budgeted account under the annual budget appropriation made to the  
210 university.

211 (b) Commencing January 1, 2000, the first semiannual report in each  
212 year submitted in accordance with subsection (a) of this section shall  
213 include such information as requested by the bonding subcommittee of  
214 the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having  
215 cognizance of matters relating to finance, revenue and bonding,  
216 commerce and higher education including but not limited to: (1) The  
217 use of bond funds in the current fiscal year, (2) projected use of bond  
218 funds for the next succeeding fiscal year, (3) an updated master plan  
219 for the balance of the project, and (4) the use of Connecticut-owned  
220 businesses, including businesses owned by women and minorities. In  
221 the event that said bonding subcommittee determines that there has  
222 been a significant change in the economic circumstances of the state  
223 sufficient to warrant recommendations for modification of the  
224 program, the subcommittee may make recommendations for  
225 appropriate action to said committee.

226 (c) Not later than January 1, 2016, and annually thereafter, the  
227 university shall report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-  
228 4a, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having  
229 cognizance of matters relating to finance, revenue and bonding,  
230 commerce and higher education on its progress toward achieving the  
231 goals set forth in the plan developed pursuant to section 502 of this act.  
232 The report shall include a summary of the research and economic  
233 development activities of the university, including, but not limited to,  
234 (1) research proposals, research awards and research expenditures; (2)  
235 student applications, student enrollment and degrees awarded at the

236 bachelor's, master's and doctoral levels; (3) industry partnerships  
 237 including joint projects, consortium projects and incubator support; (4)  
 238 a summary of university and joint university-industry intellectual  
 239 property activities, including the number of disclosures, patents,  
 240 licenses, new businesses and entrepreneurial activities established with  
 241 university technologies; and (5) identification of research and  
 242 innovation benchmarks and an analysis of the university's progress in  
 243 meeting such benchmarks in comparison to nationally-ranked research  
 244 universities."
