

Leadership

To the Connecticut Legislative body considering HB 6519 to label Genetically Modified Foods for Connecticut consumers I respectfully submit the following calling for leadership, in this matter.

Last year Resolutions calling for Legislative Leadership were submitted by many forces, among them the Ledge-light Health District, and the City of Hartford to label GMO foods for Connecticut consumers. This year this call has expanded to the owners of the following Connecticut Farms: Cedar Meadows Farm in Ledyard, Studio Farms in Voluntown, Highland Thistle Farm in Brooklyn, Stony Ledge Farm in Pawtucket, Aiki Farms. and Hidden Brook Farms in Ledyard, which I have been designated to represent submitting the following in concert with the call for Legislative Leadership on the Labeling of genetically Modified foods sold in Connecticut.

1. When a corporation takes over the FDA via the "revolving door" policy and blatantly tells us that there is no difference between the Patented Laboratory created Genetically Modified Foods, and non GMO foods, this is chaos.

2. When tons of food enter our system with severe objection by the FDA Science staff, defying their call for adequate testing, and their findings being ignored by the FDA management staff. This is chaos.

3. When we, as responsible citizens all have identification by name, and by social security number, taking responsibility for our role in society how is it that the Biotech Industry controlled agriculture refuses to share that responsibility with the rest of us? Not only refusing to take responsibility, but spending millions of dollars to hide their Genetically Modified foods in our system? This is chaos.

4. When GMO foods appear on the store shelves of Connecticut Consumers, the same foods that are shipped and labeled for the Asian and European consumer without that consideration for the Connecticut Consumer, our families, and our Legislators, this is chaos.

It is a time for us all to stop being indecisive in this matter. It is a time for us all to demand that the food Industry extend care, compassion and responsibility for their actions which obviously not only are they not prepared to do, but in defiance of food justice, and equity for Connecticut Consumers dare threaten us with vindictive threats of unnecessarily choosing to "raise prices" should we secure equity with our Asian and European Consumers, demanding fair treatment by the food Industry.
