

DEPARTMENT OF CONSUMER PROTECTION**Notice of Intent to Amend Regulations**

In accordance with the authority granted in Section 21a-243 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended by Section 18 of Public Act No. 12-55, it is the intention of the State of Connecticut, Department of Consumer Protection, to amend the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies by amending Sections 21a-243-7 and 21a-243-8.

All interested persons who wish to express their views orally may do so at a public hearing to be held at the Department of Consumer Protection, Room 119, State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut, at 10:00 a.m., on Monday, November 26, 2012.

All interested parties who wish to submit data, views or arguments may do so in writing within thirty (30) days following the publication of this notice. The purpose of these regulations is to reclassify marijuana as a Schedule II controlled substance pursuant to Public Act No. 12-55.

At present, marijuana is classified as a Schedule I controlled substance. The Department's proposed regulations reclassify marijuana as a Schedule II controlled substance.

At present, marijuana is classified as a Schedule I controlled substance. Under this classification, marijuana cannot be legally produced, prescribed or possessed. The Department's proposed regulations classify marijuana as a Schedule II controlled substance. As a Schedule II controlled substance, marijuana can be legally produced, prescribed and dispensed under strict controls.
