DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice of Intent to Adopt Regulations

In accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of section 4-168 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, notice is hereby given that the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services under the authority of section 17b-262 of the Connecticut General Statutes, intends to adopt regulations concerning the requirements for payment of behavioral health clinic services provided to clients in the Medicaid program by adding sections 17b-262-817 to 17b-262-828, inclusive, to the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies. These sections pertain to requirements for payment to providers of behavioral health clinic services.

Statement of purpose: The purpose of the proposed regulation is to establish, in regulation form, the requirements for payment of behavioral health clinic services provided to individuals covered by the Medicaid program. The problems, issues or circumstances that the regulation proposed to address: the current policy, found in the department's Medical Services Policy Manual, requires technical changes to accurately reflect current policy and practice.

The main provisions of the regulation propose to (1) add new definitions as necessary; (2) incorporate current practice; and (3) clarify the prior authorization process, documentation requirements and billing procedures.

The legal effect of the regulation is to put in regulation form the Department's current policies and procedures regarding the payment of behavioral clinic services under the Medicaid program.

CONNECTICUT RESOURCES RECOVERY AUTHORITY

Notice of Revised Procurement Policies and Procedures

Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. sections 1-121 and 22a-268a, Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority ("CRRA") hereby gives notice by publication in the Connecticut Law Journal that it intends to adopt the aforementioned revised Policies and Procedures at its **September 24, 2009 Board Meeting commencing at 9:30 a.m.** at CRRA's offices in the **Stratford Recycling Center** located at **1410 Honeyspot Road Extension, Stratford, CT**. Interested persons may present their views at that time.

The proposed revision to the Procurement Policies and Procedures would amend Section 4.6 thereof to specifically allow CRRA to reject any bid or proposal submitted by a bidder which (or any principal, director, or officer of which) has engaged in action indicating a lack of business integrity.

The purpose of the proposed revision to the Policies and Procedures is to promote CRRA's goal of contracting with counterparties that maintain high ethical standards.
