**"AN ACT CONCERNING ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR PERMITS."**

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2014*) (a) The Commissioner of  
4 Consumer Protection shall issue an off-site farm winery sales and  
5 tasting permit to a holder of a manufacturer permit for a farm winery  
6 upon the holder's submission of proof to the commissioner that the  
7 holder is in compliance with the requirements of subsection (e) of  
8 section 30-16 of the general statutes. An off-site farm winery sales and  
9 tasting permit shall authorize the sale and offering of free samples of  
10 wine manufactured from the farm winery during a total of not more  
11 than seven events or functions per year held pursuant to a temporary  
12 liquor permit issued pursuant to section 30-35 of the general statutes, a  
13 charitable organization permit issued pursuant to section 30-37b of the  
14 general statutes or a nonprofit corporation permit issued pursuant to  
15 section 30-37h of the general statutes, at locations outside the

16 manufacturer permit for a farm winery holder's permit premises,  
17 provided such holder: (1) Notifies the Department of Consumer  
18 Protection, on a form prescribed by the Commissioner of Consumer  
19 Protection, not less than five business days prior to the date of the  
20 event or function, of the date, hours and location of each event or  
21 function, (2) sells only wine by the bottle at the event or function, and  
22 (3) is present, or has an authorized representative present, at the time  
23 of the sale of any bottle of wine or the offering of a free sample of wine  
24 from the farm winery at the event or function. An off-site farm winery  
25 sales and tasting permit shall be valid for a period of one year from the  
26 date of issuance. The annual fee for such permit shall be two hundred  
27 fifty dollars. There shall be a one-hundred-dollar nonrefundable filing  
28 fee for any such permit.

29 (b) Any town or municipality may, by ordinance or zoning  
30 regulation, prohibit the sale or offering of free samples of wine by the  
31 holder of an off-site farm winery sales and tasting permit at an event or  
32 function held in such town or municipality.

33 Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 30-48 of the 2014 supplement to the  
34 general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
35 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2014*):

36 (a) No backer or permittee of one permit class shall be a backer or  
37 permittee of any other permit class except in the case of any class of  
38 airport, railroad, airline and boat permits, and except that: (1) A backer  
39 of a hotel or restaurant permit may be a backer of both such classes; (2)  
40 a holder or backer of a manufacturer permit for a brew pub, a  
41 restaurant permit or a cafe permit may be a holder or backer of any  
42 other or all of such classes; (3) a holder or backer of a restaurant permit  
43 may be a holder or backer of a bowling establishment permit; (4) a  
44 backer of a restaurant permit may be a backer of a coliseum permit or a  
45 coliseum concession permit, or both, when such restaurant is within a  
46 coliseum; (5) a backer of a hotel permit may be a backer of a coliseum  
47 permit or a coliseum concession permit, or both; (6) a backer of a  
48 coliseum permit may be a backer of a coliseum concession permit; (7) a

49 backer of a coliseum concession permit may be a backer of a coliseum  
50 permit; (8) a backer of a grocery store beer permit may be a backer of a  
51 package store permit if such was the case on or before May 1, 1996; (9)  
52 a backer of a university permit may be a backer of a nonprofit theater  
53 permit; (10) subject to the discretion of the department, a backer of a  
54 permit provided for in section 30-33b, may be a backer of any other  
55 retail on-premise consumption permit, including those permits  
56 provided for in section 30-33b; (11) a backer of a nonprofit theater  
57 permit may be a holder or backer of a hotel permit; (12) a holder or  
58 backer of a restaurant permit may be a holder or backer of a special  
59 outing facility permit; (13) a backer of a concession permit may be a  
60 backer of a coliseum permit or a coliseum concession permit, or both;  
61 (14) a holder of an out-of-state winery shipper's permit for wine may  
62 be a holder of an in-state transporter's permit or an out-of-state entity  
63 wine festival permit issued pursuant to section 30-37m, or of both such  
64 permits; (15) a holder of an out-of-state shipper's permit for alcoholic  
65 liquor other than beer may be a holder of an in-state transporter's  
66 permit; and (16) a holder of a [manufacturer's] manufacturer permit for  
67 a farm winery may be a holder of an in-state transporter's permit, a  
68 wine festival permit issued pursuant to section 30-37l, a farmers'  
69 market wine sales permit issued pursuant to subsection (a) of section  
70 30-37o, an off-site farm winery sales and tasting permit issued  
71 pursuant to section 1 of this act or of any combination of such permits.  
72 Any person may be a permittee of more than one permit. A person  
73 may be a permittee under a permit provided for in section 30-33b and  
74 a backer of any other retail on-premise consumption permit, including  
75 those permits provided for in section 30-33b. The operator of a racing  
76 or jai alai exhibition with pari-mutuel betting licensed by the  
77 Department of Consumer Protection may be a backer of any permit  
78 provided for in section 30-33b. No holder of a manufacturer permit for  
79 a brew pub and no spouse or child of such holder may be a holder or  
80 backer of more than three restaurant permits or cafe permits."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
