Substitute Senate Bill No. 442

Senate, May 2, 2014

The Committee on Energy and Technology reported through SEN. DUFF of the 25th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE GARBAGE MUSEUM IN STRATFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2014*) Notwithstanding the provisions of
2 section 22a-219d of the general statutes, the Commissioner of Energy
3 and Environmental Protection may make a one-time grant-in-aid
4 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, to the Connecticut
5 Resources Recovery Authority from the Municipal Tipping Fee Fund,
6 established in section 22a-219d of the general statutes, for the purpose
7 of funding the operations of the authority's Garbage Museum,
8 provided such grant-in-aid shall not exceed one hundred thousand
9 dollars.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill allows the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) to make a one-time grant-in-aid, up to \$100,000, to the Connecticut Resources Recovery Authority (CRRA) from the Municipal Tipping Fee Fund for CRRA's garbage museum in FY 15.

As such, this may result in costs up to \$100,000 from DEEP, in FY 15 only, for a one-time grant, to CRRA.

In FY 13, CRRA spent \$89,626 for garbage museum operations.

The Out Years

There is no annualized ongoing fiscal impact as the grant may occur in FY 15 only.
