SB 407, An Act Concerning a Hospital Quality of Care Initiative

I submit my testimony in support of Senate Bill 407, An Act Concerning A Hospital Quality of Care Initiative.

Johnson Memorial Hospital supports Senate Bill 407 because it seeks to improve health outcomes for Medicaid recipients who are hospitalized and to save state Medicaid funding on unnecessary emergency room visits, hospitalization and readmissions.

This bill, if it becomes law will accomplish this purpose through implementation of best practices in health care delivery to Medicaid patients agreed upon through a collaborative process between the Department of Social Services and the Connecticut Hospital Association.

When successfully implemented the State of Connecticut and its hospital industry will be joined in a cooperative effort to reform our state Medicaid healthcare system in a manner that improves care capability and accountability by shifting the Medicaid payments from payment for volume of services provided to a payment system based on value - focusing on the outcomes and quality of care people receive. The changes proposed by this bill will also allow hospitals to use Medicaid dollars to invest in the infrastructure needed to make care more effective. In addition as has been true in other quality initiatives in which Johnson Memorial Hospital participates, best practices and innovative successes at individual institutions can be shared more broadly to ensure system wide benefits.

Johnson Memorial Hospital has always been committed to improving patient experience and ensuring that every person receives safe, excellent care. In fact we believe that just like clean air, pure water, public safety and excellent education facilities, a high-quality healthcare system is a foundational building block for any successful economic growth policy as it creates an environment that creative businesses and skilled workers expect. In many communities the health care center is a major economic driver to support its population's wellness and business initiatives.

In pursuit of excellence in patient care and quality, Johnson has recently adopted High-Reliability safety and quality initiatives for its organization.
