#### EXCEPTIONS

##### Non-substantive technical amendments and technical repeals

Notice of Intent is not required. However, on and after July 1, 2013, the text of proposed non-substantive technical amendments and repeals must be submitted to the Secretary of the State for posting on this web page before being submitted for approval to the Attorney General and and Legislative Regulation Review Committee. No public hearing or comment period is required. (See *CGS Section 4-168(g)*, as amended.)



**NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND REGULATIONS**

In accordance with the authority granted in Sections 4-168 and 21a-58 of the Connecticut General Statutes, it is the intention of the State of Connecticut, Department of Consumer Protection to amend the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies by adding Section 21a-58-38, concerning Frozen Desserts.

All interested persons who wish to express their views orally may do so at a public hearing to be held at the Department of Consumer Protection, Room 119, State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut, 06106 at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, October 9, 2014.

All interested parties who wish to submit data, views or arguments may do so in writing within thirty (30) days following the publication of this notice. Such written materials should be directed to William M. Rubenstein, Commissioner, Department of Consumer Protection, Room 103, State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut, 06106.

The purpose of these regulations is to provide an alternate means of production for some types of frozen desserts. To ensure an unadulterated product, the regulations allow the mixing of previously pasteurized products, while requiring the use of specific refrigeration temperatures for such derived mixtures. Date marking is also required.

With these regulations, retail manufacturers of frozen desserts will be allowed to employ an alternate production process which makes use of previously pasteurized ingredients. The legal effect of this proposal would be to add a new, alternate set of standards for the safe preparation of frozen desserts.
