SUMMARY OF REGULATION

The proposed regulations are meant to establish guidelines for electronic drug records maintained by medical practitioners.

The proposed regulations amend existing regulations, Sections 21a-244a-1 through 21a-244a-4. The amendments add medical practitioners to regulations that establish requirements for electronic data processing systems that create and maintain drug records.

These regulations establish requirements for electronic data processing systems for the creation and maintenance of drug records by medical practitioners. Medical practitioners who violate these regulations are subject to administrative action being taken against their Controlled Substance Registrations issued by the Department of Consumer Protection.

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
