

I've heard that the Appropriations Committee will have a meeting on proposed legislation to restrain government spending. I think that is a great proposal in order to eliminate government debt. The Connecticut legislature and Governor are always exceeding the budget and increasing the state's debt. If there is an unexpected major emergency then money in restraint can be given to help out but the legislature should reduce correspondingly the budgets for one or more other departments that would be easy for the departments to take.
