SUPPORT OF HB 6955

Why ban the sale of Ivory? Why save the elephants? Elephants will be extinct in our lifetime – probably 20 years from now. The sale of ivory anywhere promotes the killing of these magnificent, intelligent animals.

Do you know that China is the leading cause of the sale of ivory and the illegal poaching of elephants? They have ships sitting on the shores of Africa waiting to smuggle the ivory out. In China, they are openly selling ivory in stores all over. China has sent its political heads over to Africa to pay off the government there to allow them to poach elephants within the preserves meant to protect them.

If they are lucky, the babies are saved by local Africans who care for them in orphan elephant rescues, which have been created from this sad situation. They describe the babies as traumatized, because they have seen their whole family and mother wiped out in front of them.

Rhinos do not even have real horns, it is just hard, matted hair. They are killed for their horns as well, and some are tranquilized by poachers and their horns hacked off while they are under. They then wake up in pool of blood and sometimes take days to die from their injuries. Again the baby rhinos are left orphaned. As we speak, there are only 7 white Rhinos left in existence – seven away from extinction.

Connecticut must be on board to ban the sale of ivory - the town I live in Ivoryton, was built on the tusks from elephants. While I love my town, I am not in love with this fact.
