The Committee on Public Safety and Security reported through REP. DARGAN of the 115th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF CYBERSECURITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Department of
2 Administrative Services, in consultation with the Department of
3 Emergency Services and Public Protection, shall, within available
4 appropriations, conduct a study to identify cybersecurity issues facing
5 the state and to make recommendations regarding specific actions that
6 the state can implement to promote and coordinate communication
7 between government entities, law enforcement, institutions of higher
8 education, the private sector and the public to improve cybersecurity
9 preparedness.

10 (b) Not later than January 1, 2017, the Department of Administrative
11 Services shall submit the results of such study and any
12 recommendations to the joint standing committee of the General
13 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public safety and
14 security, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the
15 general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
