**AN ACT REQUIRING WRITTEN PERMISSION TO PLACE A
DONATION BIN IN A PUBLIC PLACE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Section 21a-430 of the general statutes is repealed and the
2 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2015*):

3 (a) No person shall place or cause to be placed in a public place a
4 donation bin for the donation of clothing or other articles unless such
5 person has been granted written permission to place such donation bin
6 in such public place by the owner of such public place or by such
7 owner's duly authorized agent and unless such bin contains a notice in
8 block letters at least two inches high stating: (1) If the donation is for a
9 charitable purpose, (A) the name of the nonprofit organization that
10 will benefit from the donation, (B) the name of the owner of such bin,
11 and (C) that the public may contact the Department of Consumer
12 Protection for further information, or (2) if not intended for a charitable
13 purpose, that such donation is not for a charitable purpose. Such notice
14 shall be on the same side of the bin where the donation is likely to be
15 made. As used in this section, "public place" means any area that is
16 used or held out for use by the public, whether owned or operated by

17 public or private interests, and "donation bin" means a large container
18 commonly placed in a parking lot for the purpose of encouraging
19 individuals to donate clothing or other items.

20 (b) Any person who violates any provision of subsection (a) of this
21 section shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
