Title: AN ACT EXTENDING CREDITOR PROTECTION TO AMOUNTS PAYABLE TO A PARTICIPANT OF OR BENEFICIARY UNDER AN ANNUITY PURCHASED TO FUND EMPLOYEE OR RETIREE RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

Statement of Purpose: To require an insurance company to provide certain disclosures to employees and retirees of an employer when such company issues a group annuity contract to provide retirement benefits to such employees and retirees, and to protect amounts payable under such annuity contract from creditors of participants and beneficiaries.
