MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF CONNECTICUT RAISED BILL NO. 6828

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A STATE FILM PERMITTING PROCESS

The Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. (MPAA) and its member companies*, which are the largest producers and distributors of motion pictures in the U.S., support Connecticut Raised Bill No. 6828. The bill will streamline the film permitting process for state-owned properties in Connecticut.

If enacted, the bill would designate the Office of Film, Television and Digital Media as the statewide point of contact for any motion picture or television production wishing to film on state-owned property. Ideally, the Office will be able to work directly with other state agencies to expedite permits and solve production problems in a timely and efficient manner, rather than requiring productions to negotiate with each individual state agency when filming in Connecticut.

As you are no doubt aware, motion picture and television productions work under tight deadlines with very short turnaround times. The timely processing of film permits is an important factor in attracting production to Connecticut. We urge the Committee to support Raised Bill No. 6828, which will streamline the permitting process and make Connecticut a more film-friendly location.
