Senate Bill No. 321

The Committee on Children reported through SEN. BARTOLOMEO of the 13th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING FUNDING FOR A PARENT MENTOR PILOT PROGRAM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2015*) The sum of two hundred thousand
2 dollars is appropriated to the city of New Haven, from the General
3 Fund, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, for the purpose of a
4 grant to develop and implement a parent mentor pilot program for the
5 purpose of providing healthy developmental interventions and
6 support to teen mothers of children three years of age or younger and
7 the children of such teen mothers.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill appropriates \$200,000 to the City of New Haven in FY 16 for a program to assist teen mothers with children age three or younger. This results in a cost to the General Fund of \$200,000 and a corresponding revenue gain to the City of New Haven. The bill does not specify what state agency must make this payment.

There is no fiscal impact in the out years, as the bill only appropriates funding in FY 16.
