Substitute Senate Bill No. 351

*Senate, April 13, 2015*

The Committee on Environment reported through SEN. KENNEDY of the 12th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT CONCERNING THE TASK FORCE ON THE HUMANE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS IN MUNICIPAL ANIMAL SHELTERS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The task force on the humane  
2 treatment of animals in municipal and regional shelters and other  
3 matters concerning the operation of such municipal and regional  
4 shelters, as established in section 3 of public act 14-205, and the  
5 membership of such task force, as appointed as of December 1, 2014,  
6 shall continue to consider those matters prescribed in section 3 of  
7 public act 14-205 and, not later than February 1, 2016, shall submit the  
8 report required by section 3 of public act 14-205 or any revisions to  
9 such report.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Section 1	<i>from passage</i>	New section
