**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE DIVISION OF STATE-WIDE
EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS."**

1 Strike subsection (a) of section 3 in its entirety and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(a) (1) In order to establish the state-wide enhanced 9-1-1 service,
4 every telephone company providing service within the state shall
5 provide, not later than December 31, 1989, selective routing, automatic
6 number identification and automatic location identification [features as
7 a tariffed service] in compliance with a time schedule approved by the
8 [office] division.

9 (2) In order to establish the next generation 9-1-1
10 telecommunications system, every telephone company providing
11 service within the state shall provide selective routing, automatic
12 number identification and automatic location identification, and may

13 provide the latitude and longitude of any telephone or device used to
14 place a 9-1-1 call, in compliance with a time schedule approved by the
15 division."

16 Strike subsection (a) of section 8 in its entirety and substitute the
17 following in lieu thereof:

18 "(a) A telephone company or voice over Internet protocol service
19 provider, as defined in section 28-30b, as amended by this act, shall
20 forward to any public safety answering point or other answering point
21 equipped for the enhanced 9-1-1 service or the next generation 9-1-1
22 telecommunication system the telephone number and street address of
23 any telephone or device used to place a 9-1-1 call and may forward the
24 latitude and longitude of any telephone or device used to place a 9-1-1
25 call, provided a voice over Internet protocol service provider shall be
26 in compliance with this subsection if the provider complies with the
27 requirements for forwarding such information [contained in 47 CFR 9]
28 in accordance with federal regulations and this chapter, provided the
29 provisions of this chapter are not addressed by, or are not inconsistent
30 with, federal law or regulations regarding the provision of enhanced 9-
31 1-1 service and the next generation 9-1-1 telecommunication system in
32 the state of Connecticut. Subscriber information provided in
33 accordance with this subsection shall be used only for the following
34 purposes: (1) Responding to [emergency] 9-1-1 calls, (2) investigating
35 false or intentionally misleading reports of incidents requiring
36 emergency service, or (3) enabling emergency notification systems.
37 Subscriber information collected in accordance with subdivision (3) of
38 this subsection shall be used only in case of an emergency. Subscriber
39 information provided pursuant to this subsection and any subscriber
40 information or any telephone number, mailing address or electronic
41 mail address provided to the state in order for the state to use such
42 information in connection with an emergency notification system shall
43 be confidential and shall not be subject to disclosure pursuant to the
44 Freedom of Information Act, as defined in section 1-200."
