NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATION

In accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of Section 4-168 of the Connecticut General Statutes, notice is hereby given that the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, pursuant to the authority of section 14-150 of the Connecticut General Statutes, proposes to adopt this regulation concerning the procedures for campground owners to dispose of abandoned motor homes or recreational vehicles.

Statement of purpose: The purpose of this proposal is to provide procedures for the disposal of a recreational vehicle that has been abandoned on a campground owner's property in violation of any campground agreement. The procedures set forth are similar to those governing a motor vehicle abandoned at a self-service storage facility, and prescribe the legal notices that the campground owner must send to the recreational vehicle owner of record, if known, and lienholder, if any, before such disposal. The regulation requires the campground owner to obtain vehicle owner and lienholder information through a check of the agency's title and registration records prior to disposal of such vehicle. However, this check is limited to recreational vehicles that are titled or registered by the Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicles. The agency is unable to determine the owner and lienholder of a vehicle registered and titled in another state.
