Explanation of State Impact of Regulation: Using staff and resources currently available, the state will continue to provide general supervision and technical assistance to local and regional boards of education for the provision of medication administration pursuant to the C.G.S 10-212a.

Explanation of Municipal Impact of Regulation: The addition of the emergency administration of epinephrine to students who do not have a prior written authorization will require school districts to examine their current staffing levels, the qualifications of staff and the supply of epinephrine in cartridge injectors that shall be available in each school in order to meet the new regulation requirements. It will also require additional training by the school nurse for emergency administration of epinephrine by non-nursing personnel.
