

Senate Bill No. 21

Public Act No. 16-153

AN ACT CONCERNING THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT'S NONDISCRIMINATION LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 27-59 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

[No] <u>Subject to federal law or regulation governing membership in the National Guard, no</u> person shall be denied membership in the armed forces of the state, nor be discriminated against in the matter of promotion therein, on account of [his race, creed or color] <u>such person's religion, national origin, color, race, sex, gender identity or expression or sexual orientation</u>. No units of such organizations shall be formed, and no separate types of duties or separate accommodations shall be assigned, in such a manner as to result in the segregation of members thereof on account of [race, creed or color] <u>religion, national origin, color, race, sex, gender identity or expression or sexual orientation, except that accommodations may be assigned consistent with any federal military regulation or service policy</u>.
