

Dear Energy and Technology Committee,

We need to do more to cut GHG emissions NOW. Four out of five Connecticut residents can't have solar on their roofs because their homes are shaded or they're renters. Shared solar allows anyone with an electric bill to buy a portion of solar power from a larger solar array. Subscribers get the benefits of clean energy without having to install solar panels on their roofs. **I support shared solar and S.B. 334**, which would make technical changes to the state's shared solar law. This should be passed instead of H.B. 5427, a deeply flawed shared solar bill that would ruin the state's pilot program for shared solar by adding financing requirements that would make projects uneconomic.
