Hello,

I am very concerned about this bill and the language change being proposed.

If this bill passes and you take out:

[who has reasonable suspicion of a crime]  
and  
[that is observed by such law enforcement officer.]

you are taking away people's fourth amendment rights.

Here is an example of what can happen if this passes.

A person is sitting in their car eating their lunch, reading a book or just waiting for a friend, etc... when a police officer approaches and demands to see their drivers license and gun permit for no reason other than that person has a NRA, CCDL sticker, Molon Labe, or any other type of sticker supporting 2a.
