AN ACT REQUIRING THE SECRETARY OF THE OFFICE OF POLICY AND MANAGEMENT TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF IMPLEMENTING A FORTY-HOUR WORK WEEK FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Secretary of the Office of Policy
2 and Management shall conduct a study of the impact of requiring all
3 state employees to work a forty-hour work week. On or before October
4 1, 2016, the secretary shall report, in accordance with the provisions of
5 section 11-4a of the general statutes, the findings of such study to the
6 joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance
7 of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies
8 and labor and public employees. Such report shall include a summary
9 of the potential positive and negative impacts, including any financial
10 impacts, implementing such forty-hour work week may have on the
11 state.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
