

DOC Management Strategies

- While keeping aligned with our agency mission and strategic plan, control overtime usage and refill positions on a critical need basis.
- Improve wellness of both the staff and inmates by reducing the effects of trauma throughout the system. Improving the health and wellbeing will reduce the utilization of sick time and workers compensation by staff and reduce the cost of providing inmate medical care.
- Employ LEAN to eliminate non value added activities to streamline processes and procedures and leverage technology to create efficiencies, enhance communication and reduce labor requirements.
- Use data to drive decision making and to improve outcomes by measuring the performance of agency programs, policies and initiatives and by employing evidence based offender management and rehabilitation/reentry practices.
