House Bill No. 5615

The Committee on Government Administration and Elections reported through REP. JUTILA of the 37th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 9-606 of the general statutes is
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
3 *1, 2016*):

4 (c) The treasurer of each committee, other than a political committee
5 established by an organization which receives its funds from the
6 organization's treasury, may appoint solicitors. If solicitors are
7 appointed, the treasurer shall receive and report all contributions
8 made or promised to each solicitor. Each solicitor shall submit to the
9 treasurer a list of all contributions made or promised to him. The list
10 shall be complete as of seventy-two hours immediately preceding
11 midnight of the day preceding the dates on which the treasurer is
12 required to file a sworn statement as provided in section 9-608. Lists
13 shall be received by the treasurer not later than twenty-four hours
14 immediately preceding each required filing date. Each solicitor shall

15 deposit all contributions with the treasurer [, within] not later than
16 seven days after receipt. No solicitor shall expend any contributions
17 received by him or disburse such contributions to any person other
18 than the treasurer.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
