**Written Testimony Opposing House Bill 5635,  
An Act Concerning Fraud Committed Through Telephone  
Solicitation and Access To Telephone Records**

Senator Coleman, Representative Tong, and members of the Judiciary Committee. My name is David McGuire, and I am the Legislative and Policy Director for the American Civil Liberties Union of Connecticut (ACLU-CT). I am submitting this testimony in opposition to House Bill 5635, An Act Concerning Fraud Committed Through Telephone Solicitation and Access To Telephone Records.

Section 7 of this bill makes several changes to CGS § 54-47aa but does not fully resolve the Fourth Amendment concerns that have been raised about warrantless cell phone tracking conducted pursuant to the law. There have been extended discussions between our organization, the State's Attorney's office and the Public Defender's office about this law. The product of these discussions is House Bill 5640, An Act Concerning Compelled Disclosure of Cellular Telephone and Internet Records. House Bill 5640 will bring § 54-47aa into conformity with the Fourth Amendment. We respectfully ask you to adopt the comprehensive language in House Bill 5640 in lieu of section 7.
