"AN ACT PROTECTING VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE."

1 Strike sections 11 to 14, inclusive, in their entirety, and insert the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Sec. 11. Section 29-32 of the general statutes is repealed and the
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2016*):

5 (a) For the purposes of this section, "conviction" means the entry of a
6 judgment of conviction by any court of competent jurisdiction.

7 (b) Any state permit or temporary state permit for the carrying of
8 any pistol or revolver may be [revoked] suspended by the
9 Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection for cause
10 and shall be [revoked] suspended by said commissioner upon
11 conviction of the holder of such permit of a felony or of any

12 misdemeanor specified in subsection (b) of section 29-28, as amended
13 by this act, or upon the occurrence of any event which would have
14 disqualified the holder from being issued the state permit or
15 temporary state permit pursuant to subsection (b) of section 29-28, as
16 amended by this act. Upon the [revocation] suspension of any state
17 permit or temporary state permit, the person whose state permit or
18 temporary state permit is [revoked] suspended shall be notified in
19 writing and such state permit or temporary state permit shall be
20 forthwith delivered to the commissioner. Any law enforcement
21 authority shall confiscate and immediately forward to the
22 commissioner any state permit or temporary state permit that is
23 illegally possessed by any person. The commissioner may [revoke]
24 suspend the state permit or temporary state permit based upon the
25 commissioner's own investigation or upon the request of any law
26 enforcement agency. Any person who fails to surrender any permit
27 within five days of notification in writing of [revocation] suspension
28 thereof shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

29 (c) Any local permit for the carrying of a pistol or revolver issued
30 prior to October 1, 2001, may be [revoked] suspended by the authority
31 issuing the same for cause, and shall be [revoked] suspended by the
32 authority issuing the same upon conviction of the holder of such
33 permit of a felony or of any misdemeanor specified in subsection (b) of
34 section 29-28, as amended by this act, or upon the occurrence of any
35 event which would have disqualified the holder from being issued
36 such local permit. Upon the [revocation] suspension of any local
37 permit, the person whose local permit is [revoked] suspended shall be
38 notified in writing and such permit shall be forthwith delivered to the
39 authority issuing the same. Upon the [revocation] suspension of any
40 local permit, the authority issuing the same shall forthwith notify the
41 commissioner. Upon the [revocation] suspension of any permit issued
42 by the commissioner, the commissioner shall forthwith notify any local
43 authority which the records of the commissioner show as having
44 issued a currently valid local permit to the holder of the permit
45 [revoked] suspended by the commissioner. Any person who fails to

46 surrender such permit within five days of notification in writing or
47 [revocation] suspension thereof shall be guilty of a class A
48 misdemeanor.

49 (d) If a state permit or temporary state permit for the carrying of any
50 pistol or revolver is suspended because the person holding such
51 permit is subject to an ex parte order issued pursuant to section 46b-15,
52 as amended by this act, or 46b-16a, as amended by this act, upon
53 expiration of such order, such person may notify the Department of
54 Emergency Services and Public Protection that such order has expired.
55 Upon verification of such expiration and provided such person is not
56 otherwise disqualified from holding such permit pursuant to
57 subsection (b) of section 29-28, as amended by this act, the department
58 shall reinstate such permit.

59 Sec. 12. Section 29-36i of the general statutes is repealed and the
60 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2016*):

61 (a) Any eligibility certificate for a pistol or revolver shall be
62 [revoked] suspended by the Commissioner of Emergency Services and
63 Public Protection upon the occurrence of any event which would have
64 disqualified the holder from being issued the certificate pursuant to
65 section 29-36f, as amended by this act.

66 (b) Upon the [revocation] suspension of any eligibility certificate,
67 the person whose eligibility certificate is [revoked] suspended shall be
68 notified in writing and such certificate shall be forthwith delivered to
69 the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection. Any
70 person who fails to surrender such certificate within five days of
71 notification in writing of [revocation] suspension thereof shall be
72 guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

73 (c) If an eligibility certificate for a pistol or revolver is suspended
74 because the person holding such certificate is subject to an ex parte
75 order issued pursuant to section 46b-15, as amended by this act, or
76 46b-16a, as amended by this act, upon expiration of such order, such
77 person may notify the Department of Emergency Services and Public

78 Protection that such order has expired. Upon verification of such
79 expiration and provided such person is not otherwise disqualified
80 from holding such certificate pursuant to section 29-36f, as amended
81 by this act, the department shall reinstate such certificate.

82 Sec. 13. Section 29-37s of the general statutes is repealed and the
83 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2016*):

84 (a) A long gun eligibility certificate shall be [revoked] suspended by
85 the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection upon
86 the occurrence of any event which would have disqualified the holder
87 from being issued the certificate pursuant to section 29-37p, as
88 amended by this act.

89 (b) Upon the [revocation] suspension of any long gun eligibility
90 certificate, the person whose certificate is [revoked] suspended shall be
91 notified, in writing, and such certificate shall be forthwith delivered to
92 the Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection. Any
93 person who fails to surrender such certificate within five days of
94 notification, in writing, of [revocation] suspension thereof shall be
95 guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

96 (c) If a long gun eligibility certificate is suspended because the
97 person holding such certificate is subject to an ex parte order issued
98 pursuant to section 46b-15, as amended by this act, or 46b-16a, as
99 amended by this act, upon expiration of such order, such person may
100 notify the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection
101 that such order has expired. Upon verification of such expiration and
102 provided such person is not otherwise disqualified from holding such
103 certificate pursuant to section 29-37p, as amended by this act, the
104 department shall reinstate such certificate.

105 Sec. 14. Section 29-38p of the general statutes is repealed and the
106 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2016*):

107 (a) An ammunition certificate shall be [revoked] suspended by the
108 Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection upon the

109 occurrence of any event which would have disqualified the holder
110 from being issued the certificate pursuant to section 29-38n.

111 (b) Upon the [revocation] suspension of any ammunition certificate,
112 the person whose certificate is [revoked] suspended shall be notified,
113 in writing, and such certificate shall be forthwith delivered to the
114 Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection. Any
115 person who fails to surrender such certificate within five days of
116 notification, in writing, of [revocation] suspension thereof shall be
117 guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

118 (c) If an ammunition certificate is suspended because the person
119 holding such certificate is subject to an ex parte order issued pursuant
120 to section 46b-15, as amended by this act, or 46b-16a, as amended by
121 this act, upon expiration of such order, such person may notify the
122 Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection that such
123 order has expired. Upon verification of such expiration and provided
124 such person is not otherwise disqualified from holding such certificate
125 pursuant to section 29-38n the department shall reinstate such
126 certificate."
