"AN ACT CONCERNING REGIONAL TECHNOLOGY."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 4d-7 of the general statutes is repealed and the
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2016*):

5 (a) The Chief Information Officer, in consultation with the
6 Commissioner of Administrative Services, shall develop, publish and
7 annually update an information and telecommunication systems

8 strategic plan, in accordance with the policies established by the Office
9 of Policy and Management, which shall have the following goals: (1)
10 To provide a level of voice and data communications service among all
11 state agencies that will ensure the effective and efficient completion of
12 their respective functions; (2) to provide all necessary
13 telecommunication services between state agencies and the public; (3)
14 to provide, in the event of an emergency, immediate voice and data
15 communications and critical application recovery capabilities which
16 are necessary to support state agency functions; and (4) to provide
17 necessary access to higher technology for state agencies.

18 (b) In order to facilitate the development of a fully integrated state-
19 wide information services and telecommunication system that
20 effectively and efficiently supports data processing and
21 telecommunication requirements of all state agencies, the strategic
22 plan shall include: (1) Guidelines and standards for the architecture for
23 information and telecommunication systems that support state
24 agencies; (2) plans for a cost-effective state-wide telecommunication
25 network to support state agencies, which network may consist of
26 different types of transmission media, including wire, fiber and radio,
27 and shall be able to support voice, data, electronic mail, video and
28 facsimile transmission requirements and any other form of information
29 exchange that takes place via electromagnetic media; (3) identification
30 of annual expenditures and major capital commitments for
31 information and telecommunication systems; (4) identification of all
32 state agency technology projects; (5) a description of the efforts of
33 executive branch state agencies to use e-government solutions to
34 deliver state services and conduct state programs, including the
35 feedback and demands of clients of such agencies received by such
36 agencies and such agencies' plans to address client concerns by using
37 online solutions, when such solutions are determined feasible by such
38 agencies; and (6) potential opportunities for increasing the efficiency or
39 reducing the costs of the state's information and telecommunication
40 systems.

41 (c) On or before August first, annually, each state agency shall

42 submit to the [Commissioner of Administrative Services] Chief
43 Information Officer all plans, documents and other information
44 requested by the [commissioner] Chief Information Officer for the
45 development of such plan.

46 (d) The Commissioner of Administrative Services shall not
47 implement a state agency proposal for information system hardware,
48 software, maintenance service or consulting unless such proposal
49 complies with the strategic plan and the agency's approved business
50 systems plan. The commissioner shall maintain a current inventory of
51 information system components to facilitate asset management and
52 procurement leverage.

53 (e) [Not later than September fifteenth, annually, the Commissioner
54 of Administrative Services shall submit the updated strategic plan to
55 the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management.] Not later than
56 October first, annually, the [Secretary of the Office of Policy and
57 Management] Chief Information Officer shall submit to the Governor,
58 the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management and the General
59 Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a, (1) the
60 updated strategic plan, and (2) a report on the activities of the
61 Department of Administrative Services and any cost savings and
62 improvements in the efficiency of information and telecommunication
63 systems of state agencies that are attributable to the efforts of the
64 Department of Administrative Services.

65 Sec. 502. (*Effective from passage*) The Chief Information Officer of the
66 Division of Information Technology within the Department of
67 Administrative Services shall include in the annual strategic plan
68 developed pursuant to section 4d-7 of the general statutes, as amended
69 by this act, and submitted to the General Assembly not later than
70 October 1, 2016, a cost-benefit analysis of whether storing the state's
71 data in a cloud-based storage system would increase the efficiency or
72 reduce the costs of the state's information and telecommunication
73 systems."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
