

To whom it may concern:

I saw the above email address contained in an article from the Journal Inquirer newspaper in their edition on 2/18. I am forwarding this email to you that I have sent to Mr Maloney at the DCP. I hope it may be of some interest to you.

Mr. Maloney,

Thank you for sharing the letter from Comm. Harris. In response to this, I would like to take a moment to share with you some information regarding the situation with my foundation. Many months ago, after I had filed a complaint with my Insurance company, Amica, and also with the DCP, the insurance co. became proactive and began an inspection and testing program to evaluate the condition of my foundation, totally funded by them. First in the process, they arranged for an inspection of my situation by a certified structural engineer. Weeks later the second phase of the process occurred, either late Nov. or early Dec., 2015, where an Eng. firm was sent to the house who took samples of the foundation cement at multiple locations and also soil samples at various points around the perimeter of the structure. The cement samples were 4" diameter plugs, full wall thickness, that we're drilled out and eventually sent to a testing firm that is headquartered in Atlanta. And just last week (2/10), the head of the Atlanta test firm flew up to CT. to also inspect my structure along with a neighbor of mine with the same foundation issues and happens to have the same insurance company, and possibly others as well.

At this time, because of the foundation situation, I am in the process of applying for a reduction in my home assessment with the Assessor's Office in the town of Vernon, so I contacted Amica's broker and requested that all the results of the inspection/test program be made available to me prior to my meeting with the town Assessor's office to support my request. I will be having a hearing sometime in late March so I was told by this broker that said reports will be available to me in mid March.

Now, if I understand correctly, there is an arrangement between the State and the Insurance community, that all information regarding foundation issues is to be shared. In any event, I would be willing to make available the report that is due me, with the DCP and/or with the office of Comm. Harris if it would be of any benefit to all parties concerned. Please advise.
