Testimony Regarding Governor's S.B. No. 19
"An Act Establishing the Transit Corridor
Development Assistance Authority"

CCAPA supports SB-19 and the Governor's continued focus on expanding the range of tools and support available for Transit Oriented Development (TOD) initiatives on Connecticut. We note the numerous revisions from last year's proposed Transit Corridor legislation that address concerns expressed by CCAPA and others, including the removal of eminent domain authority and preservation of municipal regulatory rights. The proposed version of the TCDAA presented this session is a thoughtfully-constructed tool that municipalities may voluntarily request and employ to provide additional expertise, resources, and oversight to the development and redevelopment of transit-station areas.

CCAPA appreciates that the Memorandum of Agreement process required by the bill provides an opportunity for both the Transit Corridor Development Assistance Authority and the host municipality to document short-term and long-range plans for the development district as well as to define partner responsibilities. We ask that the voluntary nature of these partnerships be respected and that participation in TCDAA projects not become a prerequisite for other types of state funding or assistance.
