NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND A REGULATION

In accordance with section 4-168(a) of the Connecticut General Statutes, notice is hereby given that the Insurance Commissioner, pursuant to the authority of sections 38a-8 and 38a-458 of the Connecticut General Statutes, proposes to adopt amended regulations concerning life insurance products providing long term care benefits.

Statement of purpose: CGS 38a-458 allows life insurance products to be sold with a rider that accelerates the death benefit for purposes of offering a long term care product. These amendments to the current regulations are being made as a result of inquiries to the Department from carriers and brokers to aid in allowing more of these products to reach the market. These updates will allow benefits to be payable in either a lump sum or in periodic payments, as well as allow for a greater number of people to access their benefits under the revised definition.

All interested persons are invited to submit written data, views or arguments in connection with the proposed action within thirty days following publication of this notice either electronically via the e-regulations system or to the State of Connecticut, Insurance Department, Attention: Kristin M.
