AN ACT CONCERNING IMPROVEMENTS TO INCOME WITHHOLDING FOR CHILD SUPPORT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (k) of section 52-362 of the general statutes is
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective*
3 *January 1, 2018*):

4 (k) The employer shall notify promptly the dependent or Support
5 Enforcement Services as directed when the obligor terminates
6 employment, makes a claim for workers' compensation benefits or
7 makes a claim for unemployment compensation benefits and shall
8 provide the obligor's last-known address and the name and address of
9 the obligor's new employer, if known. When the obligor makes a claim
10 for workers' compensation benefits, the employer shall include a copy
11 of any order for withholding received by the employer for the obligor
12 with the employer's first report of occupational illness or injury to the
13 employer's workers' compensation benefits carrier, and such benefits
14 carrier shall withhold funds pursuant to the withholding order and
15 pay any sums withheld as required by subsection (f) of this section.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	January 1, 2018	52-362(k)

To ensure more timely payments of child support from obligors who received workers' compensation benefits.
