

Student Enrollment at Select State Universities

Issue

Provide the percentages of in-state and out-of-state undergraduate students enrolled at (1) each flagship state university in New England, including UConn's Storrs campus, and (2) the top 20 public universities in the country.

Summary

This report provides undergraduate enrollment percentages by residency in the fall 2016 semester for each of the New England flagship and top 20 public universities, respectively. This semester's data is the most recent and commonly available for the universities listed in this report.

Among the New England flagship public universities, the percentage of in-state undergraduate students ranges from 28% to 78%. UConn Storrs ranks second among these universities with 74% in-state students.

Among the top 20 public universities as ranked by [U.S. News & World Report](#) in 2018, the percentage of in-state undergraduate students ranges from 53% to 91%. UConn Storrs ranks 12th among these universities.

Tables 1 and 2 below list the enrollment data by residency for these two categories of universities. The tables list the percentages of resident students and out-of-state students for each university.

Undergraduate Enrollment Data by Residency

Table 1 provides fall 2016 undergraduate enrollment data by residency for the six flagship public universities in New England, and Table 2 provides the same data for the top 20 public universities as ranked by *U.S. News & World Report* for 2018. The tables indicate when the university accounts for international students as part of the percentage of out-of-state students. This does not signify, however, that the out-of-state data for the other universities does not account for international students; for those schools, it is unclear. All data was obtained from the websites of the respective universities' institutional research, assessment, or planning; registrar; or budget offices.
