

Connecticut Penal Code — Updated and Revised

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Issue

This report lists all crimes in the Connecticut Penal Code ([Title 53a](#) of the General Statutes) and their penalties. It updates OLR Report [2016-R-0039](#).

Summary

This report lists all of the crimes contained in the Penal Code. It updates previous reports to reflect changes from the 2016 and 2017 sessions (except for new crimes not yet codified, as further explained below). Statutes with criminal penalties that are codified outside the Penal Code are not included.

Criminal offenses in Connecticut are classified as felonies, which are punishable by imprisonment for over one year, and misdemeanors, which are punishable by imprisonment for not more than one year. In turn, felonies are classified according to severity as class A, B, C, D, or E. Misdemeanors are classified as class A, B, C, or D. There are unclassified felonies and misdemeanors which are punishable by imprisonment but not designated under one of the classes listed above. (Some unclassified crimes may be deemed classified if they have the same maximum prison term as one of the classes specified above.)

Penal Code

- *Title 53a of the General Statutes*
- *The Penal Code covers many categories of offenses, including homicide, assault, sexual assault, robbery, burglary, and larceny*
- *Statutes with criminal penalties are found throughout the statutes, not just in the Penal Code*

Terms of imprisonment in Connecticut must be for specific periods of time. Judges set the specific penalty for each offender from a range of sentences and fines set out in the statutes. A judge may impose a fine, a term of imprisonment, or both.

This report focuses on prison sentences and does not include fines that apply to the crimes in the Penal Code, possible probation terms, sex offender registry requirements, or other consequences of a conviction. We also exclude statutes that are punishable as infractions or by a fine only.

Table 1 displays the crimes in the Penal Code. In addition to these crimes, the Penal Code also includes enhanced penalties for persistent offenders, acts of terrorism, and certain other types of offenders. These provisions are described in Table 2.

Penal Code Offenses

Table 1 displays all of the crimes in the Penal Code arranged by classification. It displays the authorized prison sentences for each and any mandatory minimum sentence that applies.

In addition to the crimes listed in the table, the Penal Code punishes (1) attempting or conspiring to commit any of them or (2) acting as an accomplice to one of them.

Attempt or conspiracy is a crime “of the same grade and degree as the most serious offense which is attempted or is an object of the conspiracy, except that an attempt or conspiracy to commit a class A felony is a class B felony” ([CGS § 53a-51](#)). If someone is convicted of attempt or conspiracy to commit a crime other than a class A felony that carries a mandatory minimum sentence, the offender is subject to that mandatory minimum sentence (see *State v. Moran*, 264 Conn. 593 (2003)).

Someone is an accomplice or criminally liable for the acts of another if he or she acts with the mental state required to commit a crime and solicits, requests, commands, or intentionally aids another to engage in criminal conduct. These offenders can be punished as if they were the principal offenders ([CGS § 53a-8](#)). It also appears that someone who is an accomplice to a crime that is punishable by a mandatory minimum sentence would be subject to that mandatory minimum.

During the 2017 regular legislative session, the legislature passed bills that created certain new crimes, such as specific crimes of commercial sexual abuse of a minor ([PA 17-32](#), § 4) and computer extortion by ransomware ([PA 17-223](#)). Because these crimes have not yet been codified, they do not appear in the table below. After the 2017 acts are codified (in early 2018), we will update this report to include any new crimes added to the Penal Code.

*CGS §§ [53a-28](#) and [53a-29](#) prohibit suspension or reduction of any sentence for a class A felony, meaning that the 10-year minimum sentence for a class A felony becomes a mandatory minimum, unless the statute specifies otherwise. In cases noted above, the Connecticut Supreme Court has ruled that where a more serious crime carries a lesser penalty, this penalty must prevail and be applied to the less serious crime.

Persistent Offenders, Acts of Terrorism, and Other Enhanced Sentences

A number of statutes authorize enhanced penalties for offenders who commit crimes contained in the Penal Code depending on their criminal record or the circumstances of the crime (such as using a weapon). Table 2 displays these provisions, including two provisions from outside the Penal Code because they enhance penalties for crimes contained in the Penal Code.

The Penal Code also contains provisions authorizing enhanced penalties for persistent drug possession offenders ([CGS §§ 53a-40\(f\) and \(n\)](#)). (These provisions are not included in the table because none of the underlying crimes are in the Penal Code.)
